Dear Chairman Carper and Ranking Member Capito:

On behalf of the U.S. equipment manufacturing industry, and the 1,000 member companies that make up the Association of Equipment Manufacturers (AEM), we write today to express our strong support for the *Surface Transportation Reauthorization Act of 2021*.

Equipment manufacturers are proud to support 2.8 million family-sustaining jobs – representing one in eight manufacturing jobs in the United States – and contribute \$288 billion a year to the nation's GDP. Our members supply a critical role in the construction and maintenance of our infrastructure assets. We are committed to rebuilding and modernizing our nation's roads, highways, and bridges so that we can grow our businesses, improve our quality of life, and protect our environment for future generations.

The *Surface Transportation Reauthorization Act of 2021* reflects many of the policies critical to keeping equipment manufacturers competitive in the global economy. It also takes an important bipartisan step forward in advancing the ongoing debate about the future of U.S. infrastructure. We applaud the leadership that you and the United States Senate Committee on Environment and Public Works have provided to build momentum and ensure swift passage of this important bill.

AEM particularly supports provisions in the current bill that ensure that state and local governments are provided with a multi-year, stable fiscal footing to plan and invest in infrastructure in the years ahead. Equipment manufacturers commend you and your colleagues on expeditiously moving an ambitious and bipartisan bill through the Committee, and we look forward to continuing to work with you to ensure its swift passage by the United States Senate.
